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## LOY YANG POWER WORKERS DONATE \$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$ TO G.A.R.D.S.

GARDS has been lucky enough to be one of 3 recipients chosen by workers at Loy Yang Power for the Safety Awareness Scheme during the Unit 2 Outage which has been operating throughout September. We were very honoured that the workers at Loy Yang felt we were an organisation worthy of their support. \$30,000 is made available by Loy Yang Power, Silcar and Alstom for the Safety Awareness Scheme and this money will be shared by three organisations.

GARDS representatives were invited to set up a display in the foyer of the administration building at Loy Yang A. The GARDS reps were also treated to a tour of Loy Yang by Richard Griffith and Don Wight. It was a most enjoyable afternoon. The donation will be made at the conclusion of the project with GARDS representatives to join contractors, workers and the other two organisations representatives. ## PETITION FOR GIPPSLAND

**A BIG THANK YOU**

GARDS would like to thank Pat & John Robinson & family of Moe for their very generous donation to asbestos sufferers. The Robinson family donated an oxygen concentrator for the free use of asbestos sufferers.

This machine will be put to good use in the up and coming years.

On the 14<sup>th</sup> of July, GARDS, other concerned community members, legal representation, specialist Oncology and Respiratory doctors and Gippsland Unions met to discuss what could be done to address the medical issues of asbestos in Gippsland. As a result of that meeting GARDS organised a petition asking the State Government to keep its election promise and fund the specialist cancer unit with radiotherapy in Gippsland. The petition also asked for specialist respite/hospice and palliative care facilities. The petition has been well received not only in Gippsland but throughout Victoria, with petitions coming from as far away as Mildura and Myrtleford. The petition was available on the GARDS web site for people to access and download.

The petition closed on the 9<sup>th</sup> of September and 7,400 signatures were obtained. The GARDS committee of management presented the signatures to Ian Maxfield MP and Brendan Jenkins MP at parliament on the 16<sup>th</sup> of September. The petition was handed down to parliament on the 18<sup>th</sup> of September. GARDS is waiting for a response from the government to these issues. ### COMMUNITY REFERENCE GROUP

On Wednesday the 13<sup>th</sup> of August the last Community Reference Group meeting was held. Professor Donald Campbell presented his draft report on the Lung Function Review Program to the members of the reference group. The most poignant thing to come out of the report was that mesothelioma was 7 times the national average in Latrobe Valley workers and the asbestos incidence will increase until at least 2020.

After the presentation CRG members had a chance to relay their concerns of medical needs in Gippsland to the Finance Minister John Lenders and the Deputy Health Minister Gavin Jennings.

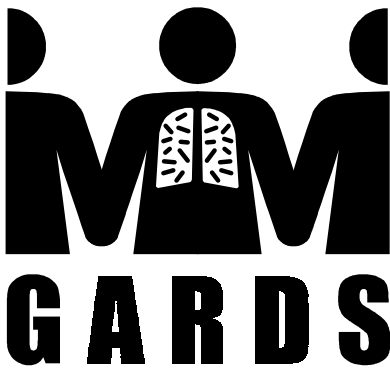
